LET'S HEAR IT FOR EISGRUBER! First things first: a warm welcome to Princeton University's twentieth president, Christopher Eisgruber. A loyal alum himself, President Eisgruber received his A.B. in physics from Princeton in 1983, graduating magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa. Though he went on to an impressive academic and legal career as a Rhodes Scholar and professor at NYU's law school, President Eisgruber's inner tiger eventually led him back to Old Nassau. In 2001, he returned to Princeton, serving as the director of the Program in Law and Public Affairs and professor of Public Affairs in the Woodrow Wilson School. In 2004, he became provost, a position he held for 9 years before being named president. Recently, President Eisgruber addressed an extremely receptive crowd of alums and parents in Manhattan, when he was interviewed by fellow alum Charlie Gibson.
